When considering my application and how people bring biases into any decision made, I found that the following three heuristics seemed highly likely for the target audience for our VR application. While these are all common for all users, I felt that addressing these three would make our application as strong as possible.

Anchoring - overly influenced by initial information we learn

Familiarity – favorable opinion of things, people, or places experienced before

Availability - opinion based on ease of recalling relevant information, correct or not

In several of my degree courses we discussed the 8 golden rules of design as suggested by Ben Shneiderman (https://www.cs.umd.edu/users/ben/goldenrules.html). I picked the following design principles based off both his suggestions as well as another more general UX design site (https://www.uxdesigninstitute.com/blog/ux-design-principles/).

Hierarchy – make important information readily available, in obvious and easy to access spots. Important information needs to guide your application. The sooner the information is seen the more influence it will have on the user experiece

Consistency – maintain consistency throughout your applications as well as applications from other developers. many people are familiar with an application or game style and the closer it is to that general layout without copying the application exactly, the better experience users will have. Information and functions will be where they expect, icons and colors will mean what they already understand them to be. Icons & colors especially are huge! People have very firm ideas what colors and

icons mean and are easily confused by large variations in either. Often the slightest confusion or frustration about an application can cause it to fail.

Reduce Short Term Memory Load – Also huge. The more people have to remember the more frustrated they will get. Forms with repeating information should be easy to reference previous information, information and data needs to be easy to find and logical. The more people can rely on the application to remember things for them, the more likely they will be to use it. An application should be able to stand alone. If someone is having to write information from an application down on paper to remember then the application needs quite a bit of work.

Overall the goal of application design should be to focus entirely on the User Experience. The application needs to work for them, not necessarily you. But it also needs to convey what you need it to or to fulfil the function you intended it to. Consider every aspect of how the user will use the application and if you have built a successful application the user should be able to pick it up and navigate it like a pro within just a few minutes without getting frustrated.





If I were to design a phone and driving experiment, I would test the GPS mapping functionalities. Stephen mentioned a school shooting and direction detection experiment here at Iowa State and I think something like that would be excellent for testing phones while driving.

Question

Does GPS type (audio vs visual vs combination) affect distracted driving level?

Variables

Independent: The type of GPS and the type of driving environment

Dependent: The level of distracted driving

Design

We will have two lists of routes: a list of cities with high, but similar, traffic styles. we will also have a list of long distance routes with complex directions, long stretches of roads, and similar traffic and stops.

We will select subjects from both city and rural driving areas at home in all states to get a large cross section of data. We will be testing the subject's data against themselves.

Subjects will be presented with lists of cities and driving routes. Subjects will then mark which cities they have visited and which routes they have driven over 51% of*.

Each subject, based on the lists they have provided us, will be asked to drive 8 different routes total, three in cities they have never visited and three long routes that are unfamiliar to them. One will be a city route that they are familiar with to gauge driving style and another will be a long route that they are also familiar with to gauge rural driving style.

The first route driven for both long distance and city will be a combination of audio played through the car speakers and a visual map displayed by a phone mounted on the dash. Both groups will use a proprietary software for directions (similar to google or apple maps). Route two will be an audio only provided route and route three will be a visual only provided route.

Data Collection & Measurements

We will be measuring how distracted drivers are while driving. The variables we will be collecting are:

time eyes left the road number of times of hard breaking number of accidents which occurred during the test time while in hard acceleration number of time evasive maneuvers had to be conducted number of missed turns number of missed turns number of illegal turns and lane changes number of times they were pulled over by officers how long their speed was greater than 5 over the speed limit in favorable conditions how long their speed was under 5 under the speed limit in favorable conditions how far off predicted arrival time they were

Based off of these measurements we will determine the relative levels of both distracted and aggressive driving, comparing their 6 GPS routes to their regular routes.

*we will decide 51% of routes driven by presenting them with a map of all the routes we will be conducting experiments on marked on the map. Participants will then be asked to draw a line through the areas where they have traveled or driven through. We will then measure the distance of each length of subject drawn line to calculate percentage along each route. If there are several routes that are below 51% we will select the three routes with the lowest percentage totals.

Hypothesis

Visual based GPS driving will cause more hazardous driving conditions while audio-based GPS will cause longer route times.

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

Which is exactly the same page that the Jobs at NASA link brings you to, but with an extra step to get there. To me this interface is convoluted and unnecessary. You do not need to two buttons for the same purpose, even if one appears to be different than the other. This is a wasted use of menus and makes the night unnecessarily complex to navigate. You stop at the first menu and ask yourself if you want a job or career at NASA, which takes time, and then after deciding on either one you are brought to the same page which made your initial ponderings a waste of time. If they were to simplify their sight, consolidate repetitive information, and remove layers of menus to make the sight more user friendly then the UI of this webpage would be greatly improved and make for a much more enjoyable exploration of the space program.

The next poorly designed UI is the Delta Airline's application for phones. The app in gneeral looks very similar to most other airline based applications (such as United or Southwest), except for this specific page:

The issue with this page is very subtle, but it is at the top. When I first received my TSA precheck number, I needed to add it onto the flights I had booked for both my trip to Houston a few weeks ago as well as the traveling to and from here. My Houston flight had been booked through United Airlines. Their phone application allowed you to enter the settings from the app, input your KTN, and then apply it to your flights. When I received my boarding pass there were no issues and my Precheck was printed correctly. With Delta however, you have to click on a link at the top of the settings page in the application which brings you to a website that you have to log into, then you can change your settings. The KTN number then shows in your application. However, there is no way to "apply" it to your flights or to check if there was an issue with getting it added to your ticket. When I arrived at the airport the very kind lady at the counter informed me (after I had discovered the Precheck had not printed with my boarding pass) that she was unable to add my KTN to my ticket for some unknown reason. The number said it was correct and my name had not been misspelled, but there was an error with the information in the Delta System and it was preventing me from accessing my precheck benefits. The reason I feel that this is poorly designed UI is that because it is such a complex system, having multiple data input and transfer points, that it was easy for it to have an error or failure which prevented the proper data from being transferred the date of the event and no way to check prior to your flight if precheck was going to print. Their UI would be significantly better if you did not have to leave the app to input any data, if there was a way to "apply" the data to your fights, and if there was a way to check to see if there were any issues with the data or the flight information which may prevent it from being added to your ticket prior to your departure date so you have time to rectify the problem.
