I have been so busy that it has become extremely hard for me to blog. Dear blog, I would just like to say, I deeply apologize for abandoning you.




Anywayyy


Turning up the Pressure



VRAC – Wednesday – 06/30/2022



It went on to discuss how the FDA recently approved the VR system, *EaseVRx*. *EaseVRx* is an eightweek program that uses VR to teach individuals breathing techniques and coping mechanisms useful for them to manage their chronic lower back pain. Charles' article discussed the satisfaction rate individuals with Attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) had while playing games using a VR system. Thomas' article discussed how VR systems can be used to create a safe space for individuals with anxiety and depression. It was very interesting to see how all of our articles were closely related to psychology, which I found very exciting.




